

**English translation:**

Umm... We were talking about the Holy Qur'an. Umm... In the 1555<sup>th</sup> year<sup>1</sup> our prophet came to this world. The book Qur'an fell off of the sky. That book is our everything. It's all four books, one being the Torah, one being the Holy Bible, one being the Psalms, one being the Qur'an. These four books are what we... we accept... Umm.... Finally, our prophet accepted the Holy Qur'an; every law, every rule, regulation, everything is included in it.
