

Turkmen transcript:

English translation:

Generally sheep's wool is needed to weave Turkmen carpets. If you paint the wool in the summer to prepare for the winter, the colors are better, too. It shines; it's saturated, and it's in bright colors. If you talk about the quality of the production of the carpets, there are 40 nodes and Turkmen hand carpets are recognized as the best carpets.
