English translation:

Habiba Surabi: ...And one of our very cultural, traditional customs is holding an ethnic *Jirga*. This is very important. Although it has a very political form, an ethnic *Jirga* is held mostly when there is a very difficult problem and one or two people can't solve it. In the *Jirga*, an important issue that should be solved is solved in consultation. And also this tradition is among other accepted traditions in our country. We believe it and we always welcome it. There are traditions in every aspect of life, not only in these aspects (political), but also in economic, social and cultural aspects. These traditions are among the very good and accepted traditions of the country, which all show our unity, and they include getting together and sharing each other's happiness and visiting each other and similar things.
