

Indonesian transcript:

Maesya: Di sekolah ini apakah ada murid-murid dari luar Jakarta?

Prita: iya, eh ... di lembaga yang saya pimpin, juga banyak mahasiswa berasal dari luar kota dan juga dari negara-negara tetangga seperti dari Malaysia, Singapura, Brunei, ataupun Australia

M: Eh...Dan di sekolah ini guru-gurunya juga dari Indonesia atau luar negeri?

P: ya, sekolah yang saya pimpin ini sangat multikultural. Jadi guru-gurunya dan mahasiswanya juga berasal dari berbagai bangsa, tidak hanya Indonesia saja.

M: Kenapa ibu pikir ..aa...banyak murid-murid datang ke sekolah ibu untuk edukasi?

P: Karena sekolah yang saya pimpin ini mempunyai eh ... standar kurikulum internasional. Dan kemudian pada saat ini adalah era informasi yang mana kurikulum atau matakuliah komunikasi sangat dibutuhkan. Sehingga banyak sekali mahasiswa yang ingin menjadi ..ee...orang yang ahli dalam komunikasi.

M: Jadinya habis mereka wisuda ingin kerja apa?

P: Mereka bisa kerja di Public Relation di perusahaan corporate seperti mining ataupun banking ya, atau juga bisa bekerja di hospitality industry seperti hotel, restaurant, resorts, eee...ataupun di media, ya. Banyak sekali tempat yang mereka bisa eh ... bekerja pada saat mereka setelah lulus dari London School.

M: Mmm ... dan kurikulumnya mereka belajar di Bahasa Indonesia atau Inggris?

P: Khusus program strata 1 atau S1, kurikulumnya itu, mata kuliahnya diajarkan dalam dua bahasa: 50% bahasa Indonesia, 50% bahasa Inggris. Namun untuk strata 2 atau program pasca sarjana, semuanya dilakukan dalam bahasa Inggris.

M: Apakah di sekolah ibu ada lebih laki-laki dari perempuan atau sama saja?

P: Kebetulan di sekolah yang saya pimpin kebanyakan perempuan, dan saya rasa seluruh sekolah komunikasi di dunia juga memang banyak wanita menjadi mahasiswanya.

M: Kenapa itu?

P: Karena mungkin para wanita lebih baik dalam berkomunikasi.

M: mmm .. apakah murid-murid di universitas ibu juga tinggal di kampus atau di luar?

P: eh ... khusus untuk sekolah yang saya pimpin, eh .. mahasiswa tidak tinggal di kampus, karena kampus-kampus London School itu berada di commercial area, yang mana sangat mudah untuk dijangkau dengan kendaraan apapun juga. Kemudian juga...eee...karena space yang sangat terbatas, di dalam eh ... commercial area, sehingga tidak memungkinkan untuk mahasiswa tinggal di dalam kampus. Biasanya mahasiswa tinggal di daerah dekat kampus atau kos-kos di dekat kampus.

M: Ada berapa kampus di sekolah ibu?

P: mmm ... sekolah london School of Public Relation terbagi atas tiga kampus, ya, kampus A, B, dan C serta juga kampus program pascasarjana dibuatkan khusus untuk program tersebut.

M: Dan di tiga kampus ini kurikulumnya sama saja atau beda-beda?

P: mmm ... kebetulan kalau di London School tahun pertama itu semua mahasiswa harus belajar bisnis study, kemudian tahun ke dua mereka boleh memilih jurusan. Kalau misalnya mereka memilih jurusan mass communication dan advertising, mereka pergi ke kampus B. Kalau mereka memilih jurusan public relations atau marketing, mereka pindah ke kampus C.

M: mmm ... di situ, apakah anda punya beasiswa untuk murid-murid yang tidak bisa bayar biaya?

P: ya ... di London School, kami mempunyai tiga jenis beasiswa. Beasiswa yang pertama diberikan kepada murid-murid SMU yang berprestasi aa....dan namun mereka tidak bisa mempunyai biaya untuk kuliah. Kemudian yang kedua beasiswa diberikan kepada mahasiswa London School yang mempunyai prestasi yang luar biasa dan berjasa kepada almamater; misalnya juara karya ilmiah atau menjadi...eee... juara dalam satu kegiatan LSPR yang membawa nama baik almamater. Yang ketiga, beasiswa paruh atau diberikan separuh dari biaya kuliah kepada mahasiswa yang kurang mampu tetapi sudah berada di dalam kampus.

English translation:

Maesya: Are there any students coming from cities other than Jakarta?

Prita: Yes, ah ... in the school that I lead, there are many students from cities other than Jakarta and from other countries such as Malaysia, Singapore, Brunei, and Australia.

M: Uh ... and are the teachers in this school from Indonesia or overseas?

P: Yes, the school that I lead is very multicultural. The teachers and students come not only from Indonesia but also from other countries.

M: Why do you think ... ah ... many students come to your school for education?

P: Because the school that I lead has ah ... an internationally standardized curriculum. And as today is the information era, curriculum or courses on communication are really needed. So, many people come to study here in order ... ah ... to be experts in communication.

M: So, after they graduate, what kinds of job are they able to get?

P: Well, they can work in public relations at corporate companies such as mining or banking, or they can work in hospitality industries like hotels, restaurants, and other resorts, uh ... or in media. There are many workplaces for which they can ... ah ... work upon the completion of study at the London School.

M: Mmm ... In your school's curriculum, do they use English or Indonesian?

P: The courses for undergraduate students are offered and taught in two languages: 50 percent in Indonesian and 50 percent in English, but, the courses for graduate students are all offered and taught in English.

M: Is the number of male students larger than that of female students or equal?

P: In this school, the number of female students is more than that of male students, and I think this applies to communication schools across the country.

M: Do you know why?

P: Maybe because women are better at communicating.

M: Mmmm . . . Do the students in your university stay on-campus or off-campus?

P: Uh ... especially for the school that I lead, uh ... the students don't live on-campus because the campus of London School is in a commercial area in which there's convenient access to public transportation to get to campus. Besides, uh ... due to limited space, in eh ... commercial areas, the students are unlikely to live on-campus. Instead, they usually live nearby or rent a room or unit near the campus.

M: How many campuses are there in your school?

P: Mmm ... Well, London School of Public Relations is composed of three campuses: Campus A, B, and C, and the other campus is built for graduate studies.

M: And is the curriculum the same or different among the three campuses?

P: Mmmm ... Let me explain it in this way. In the first year of study in the London School, all students are required to sign up for business studies, then in the second year they may choose a specialization. If, for example, they choose mass communication and advertising, they'd study at campus B. If they choose public relations or marketing, they'd go to campus C.

M: Mmm ... In your school, do you provide scholarships for students who cannot afford to pay the tuition?

P: Yes ... in the London School, we offer three kinds of scholarships. The first type of scholarship is offered to SMU¹ students with great achievements ... aa ... but they cannot afford to pay for further studies. The second type of scholarship is provided for the students of London School with great achievements and work to increase the reputation of the alma mater. For example, winners of scientific works or ... uh ... winners of any kinds of events organized by LSPR.² The third type of scholarship is not a full scholarship but a half scholarship provided for current students who are having difficulties in paying for the full tuition fee.
