

**English Translation:**

Household responsibilities in Iraq are similar to those in most Arab countries. A woman, wife or mother, is the one who takes care of most of the responsibilities, almost ninety or ninety-five percent because honestly an Iraqi man is not the type that helps with household matters.

The responsibilities are usual, i.e. cleaning, taking care of children, house arrangements, going to a market for instance, cooking; all of this is done by a woman; as for a man, no, in fact. He leaves to work in the morning and returns in the evening, and that's it. This is his role.

As for raising children, their role [parents] is common. In other words, they cooperate with each other regarding this matter.
