

**Malay Transcript:**

Ini pula ialah kari ayam. Kari ayam um.. uh.. pastinya ada ayam dan ini merupakan um.. tofu kering diguna banyak juga. Ini potato dan ini kacang hijau<sup>1</sup>. Kacang hijau sangat uh.. akan dimasak hingga sangat lembut bersama sos kari ini. Sos kari biasanya boleh.. um.. um.. cara tradisional untuk membuat sos kari ialah um.. mengguna banyak bahan dan mengisar sendiri. **English Translation:**

This is chicken curry. Chicken curry... has chicken in it, and lots of dried bean curd. These are potatoes and these are green beans. Green beans are cooked in the curry sauce until they are soft and tender. Curry sauce can usually.... The traditional way of making curry sauce utilizes many different ingredients which are self-pounded into a paste. However, you can now easily go to the market and buy pre-prepared sauce to be brought home. It [ready-made sauce] is tasty as well but definitely not as authentic.
