

Making *Àdìre* Cloth – Part 1

Yoruba transcript:

Òdòbìnrin: È jòò mà, ẹ so nípa àdìre télè, sé e lè so fún wa ní sókí nípa àdìre? Nkan tí àdìre jé.

Arábìnrin: Àdìre ni aso tí a máa fi abéré àti iko, iko ni a kì fi òwú... imí wà tí à fi òwú dí sùgbón alábéré àti iko là wa má n dí ni òdo wa. Imì ológórin, aso funfun yèn gorogoro báyi, àásepo sí méjì. À di ológórin... à n di ológóta, à di... bí a bá se fẹ kó ó wé sí. Eh... ìgbà mí, à n di ikóríta... à n di ikóríta, tí a bá di ikóríta tán nígbà mí, à di e léso. Abéré náà la... iko la fi di, à se báyi, àá di... Ìgbà tí a bá di tán, àwon tí ó máa pá láró wón á wá ko, wón á lo re nínú aró. Aró yèn dàbí dye tí wón lò nísiyí. Aró inú ikòkò ni wón se sí. Wón á fi... tí wón bá masé, wón fi omi àti emmm ó ní kiní nínú... kí lè n pe? Kí lè pe kiní yìi... *soda* á ní *soda* níní, á ní kiní kan tí wón n sù báyi.

English translation:

Young Girl: Please Ma, you talked about *ádìre*¹. Can you tell us briefly what *ádìre* means? What *ádìre* is?

Woman: *Ádìre* is a cloth that we use a needle and *ìko*² – *ìko* is used instead of thread... There are the types that we use thread to weave, but we also weave both the thread and the needle type. Some eighty... The white cloth is spread wide; it will be divided into two halves. We weave eighty, we weave sixty, we weave... depending on how tiny we want the design to be. Eh... sometimes, we weave *ikóríta*³... we weave *ikóríta*; when we are through with *ikóríta*, sometimes we weave *léso*⁴. A needle is what we use... We use *ìko* to weave it; we will do it this way⁵; we will weave... When we are done weaving, those that will dye it will come to pack it; they will go and soak it in *aró*⁶. *Aró* is the dye that is used now. *Aró* is mixed in a pot. They will put... if they make it, they will put water and emmm it has something in it... what is it called? What is this thing called? ... Soda, it will have soda, and also something that is folded like this.

² *Ìko* is raffia.

³ *Ìkóríta* is a name of one of the designs. It means crossroad.

⁴ *Léso* is another type of design.
