

Urdu transcript:

عورت: میرا نام ثمینہ ہے۔ اور میں پاکستانی ہوں۔ پاکستان میں چار صوبہ ہیں۔ میرا تعلق صوبہ پنجاب سے ہے۔ لیکن چونکہ میں کراچی میں رہتی ہوں، میری پرورش یہیں ہوئی ہے، اور میں یہیں پلی بڑھی ہوں۔ ہمارا قومی لباس شلوار قمیض ہے جو کہ میں نے اس وقت پہنا ہوا ہے۔ اور یہ دوپٹہ ہے جس کا رنگ نارنجی ہے۔ اور یہ چنری کا دوپٹہ ہے۔ اسے tie-and-dye انگلش میں کہتے ہیں۔

English translation:

Woman: My name is Samina and I am a Pakistani. Pakistan has four provinces. I hail from the province of Punjab. But because I live in Karachi, and I was brought up here, I grew up here only. Our national dress is *shalwar kameez*, which I am wearing right now. And this is the *dupatta* which is of an orange color. And this is a *chunri dupatta*. It is called tie-and-dye in English.
