

Turkish transcript:

Türkiye’de bankacılık sistemi çok gelişmiş durumda, çok fazla banka var. Devlete ait bir banka mevcut ve yine özel şirketlere ait çok sayıda banka var. Ve yabancı ülkelerin bankaları da yavaş yavaş ülkemize gelmekte.

Bankalarda ve döviz bürolarında döviz değiştirebilmeniz mümkün, döviz değişimi yapabilmeyiniz ve bunun dışında bankalarda, ATM sistemleri çok yaygın durumda. ATM’lerden istediğiniz yerden para çekebilirsiniz 24 saat. Bunun dışında bankada birikimlerinizi değerlendirebilirsiniz. Ya da bankalar aracılığıyla faturalarınızı, elektrik, su, telefon faturalarınızı ödeyebilirsiniz. Bunun dışında Türkiye’de kredi kartlarıyla alışveriş de çok yaygın. Kredi kartları hemen hemen her yerde kabul ediliyor. Çekle ödeme çok fazla yapılmaz ama yine de kullanılır.

English translation:

The banking system in Turkey is very developed; there are a lot of banks. A bank belonging to the state exists, but there are a lot of other banks belonging to corporate associations, and the banks of foreign countries have started to come to our country slowly.

It is possible to exchange money at banks and exchange offices, and other than this, ATM systems are very common. You can withdraw money from ATMs 24 hours a day, or you can invest money in the banks, or you can pay your electricity, water, telephone bills through the banking system. Other than this, shopping with credit cards is very common in Turkey. Credit cards are being accepted everywhere. Most payments would not be made by checks, but they can still be used.
