

Turkish transcript:

A: Peki organik gıda tarımı gelişmiş mi Türkiye’de? Öyle bir sektör var mı?

B: Türkiye’de organik gıda tarımı var. Ve Avrupa’ya yönelik de oldukça ciddi üretimlerin yapıldığı biliniyor, hatta beslenmede kullanılan gıdaların dışında, giyim için kullanılan pamuk ve pamuklu ürünlerde de organik tarım yapılıyor ve bunların alıcıları Avrupa ülkeleri. Türkiye’de kendi vatandaşımızın çok fazla organik tarım algılaması, en azından şehirde yaşayanların olduğu söylenemez. Ama köyde yaşayanlar zaten organik beslenmenin ne olduğunu yılların tecrübesiyle biliyorlar ve bundan yararlanıyorlar. Ama sattıkları ürünlerde bunların çok da uygulanabildiğini söylemek mümkün görünmüyor.

English translation:

A: Well, is organic food production developed in Turkey? Is there a sector like that?

B: There is organic agricultural food production in Turkey. And it is known that serious production is made towards Europe, even beyond production about food. Organic production of cotton for textile is done, and the buyers of these are European countries. It cannot be said that our own citizens in Turkey, at least the ones living in the cities, have much of a perception about organic agriculture. But those living in the villages already know what organic nutrition is and benefit from this. But it is not possible to say that these (insights) are implemented in the products they sell.
