وبعدين معك أول ما تتخرجي. طبعا لو كنتي في مدرسة دولية بتتخرجي على النظام البريطاني لو مدرسة خاصة عادية بتتخرجي على النظام حقنا. وبعدين لما يدخلوا كلية نفس الشي. في عند نحنا كليات خاصة دحين بدأوا يفتحوا في عدن، بحدود يمكن ثلاث كليات. الرسوم غالية مرة.

س: يعنى كم؟

ل: يعني بالسنة مليون، مليون تطلع كم، تطلع خمسة ألف دو لار يمكن. غالية مرة بالنسبة لدخل المواطن اليمني الافريج المواطن اليمني اللي يستلم الدخل المتوسط. صعب يعني حتى لو جلس يشتغل تلاتين سنة مايطلعش المليون.

English Translation:

L: Then you have private schools which are expensive. There are now a lot of private schools that opened in Aden. In Sana'a there are a lot of international schools¹ that give A and AP levels and send their students' exams to England. There are a lot of them in Sana'a while in Aden there is only one. Most private schools take the same exams as we do (public schools) but the language of teaching is English. To be honest, these schools are expensive; I mean most people don't send their children to private schools because they can't afford them and they are co-ed as well.

One of my friends' parents could afford the private school fees, but they refused to send her. I mean most public schools could sometimes reach an unexpected level of ignorance, wastefulness and indifference. I mean no one comes, there's no serious teaching and there is cheating too. It could reach the point where the students themselves go to school just to make trouble and hurt someone. For this reason many people take their children from public schools and send them to private schools. My friend was really influenced by the public school she used to go to because she had some bad friends. Her friends (in the classroom) were not paying attention to the lesson,

¹ International schools are private schools that use the British grading system, while private schools use the same grading system used in public schools but require higher fees than public schools.

they were laughing and gossiping but they weren't studying. Then my friend's academic level started to go down. Then her father thought of sending her to a private school, but the private school was co-ed, so he changed his mind. He sent her there for only one semester. This happened because she had a family that was very attached to traditions and customs. The co-ed system and the amount of fees really affect the number of students going to a school. Then if you are studying in an international school you will graduate according to the British system. And if you are studying in an ordinary private school you will graduate according to the government's system. Then when you go to college it's the same thing. We have private colleges that have just started in Aden, about three private colleges. However, their tuition is extremely high.

S: You mean how much?

L: I mean like one million rials per year. How much is one million Rs? It's about five thousand American dollars. It's extremely high for the average Yemeni citizen who receives an average income. I mean it's very hard, even if he/she kept working for thirty years he/she wouldn't make this much money.
