## **English translation:**

**M:** [The difference] is that it allows only women to swim. Girls like the Women's Resort because they are there by themselves; there aren't any men in the resort. So they can be completely comfortable. It's not like the other resorts where people stay at the beach and look at them [girls] swimming; so they don't feel free unless they come to this resort, which is called Women's Resort.
