Pamedical school yedu the standard time yacho ifive years of medical school. Makore maviri ekutanga unenge uri uchiita yatinoti preclinical, ndopaunenge uchidzidzi ma... anonzi mabasic sciences. Paunozopinda mugore rechitatu kusvika mune rechifive, third year, ndopaunenge waakumboonawo varwere mapatients wamuhospital manje. Saka unenge wakuzanganisa theory nepractical yemuhospital. Saka after five years kudzidza kunobva kwapera..

English translation:

At our medical school, the standard time is five years of medical school. For the first two years, you will study what we call pre-clinical. That is when you will learn the basic sciences. From the third year up until the fifth, you will now attend to patients in a hospital. So you will apply both the theory and the hospital experience. So after five years, the learning period ends.
