Mary: With religious studies, umm, can you talk more about that? I am just curious about, like can you say any religion, if you decide to pursue that?

CM: So actually I did Divinity in my 'A' Levels.

CM: For my 'A' Levels I did English Literature, History and Divinity. And basically divinity is Christian education. So it's...um, you study the New Testament of the Bible. You study the gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. You also study the prophets of the Old Testament. So that is basically Divinity and religious studies. And when you do that you can go on to a Bachelors in Divinity or a Bachelors in Religious Education, and some people actually go on to become ministers after taking Divinity. And I remember my teacher in high school was a reverend, he was a pastor and he had done Divinity in school and he had continued to get a degree in it. We also have religious education in Ordinary Level, and when you go to Advanced Level then it becomes Divinity.
